

Junior Campus BYOD iPad Requirements

Why iPad?

- ◇ Enables students to develop 21st Century Learning skills
- ◇ Allows anywhere, anytime learning
- ◇ Encourages learning in STEM and inquiry based learning
- ◇ Allows for differentiation and personalisation
- ◇ Promotes high student engagement
- ◇ Provides a consistent device for ease of use
- ◇ Bridges the gap between home and school
- ◇ Supported device by DET with minimal technical support requirements
- ◇ Vast functionality—iOS 16 and app selection
- ◇ Portability (including camera) with a 10 hour battery life

Why iOS 16? With all students running iOS 16 at a minimum, teachers can easily supervise students through the use of Apple Classroom. This allows teachers to remotely view students screens, lock students into apps and quickly share content. Support staff are also able to assist all students in the same manner.

BYOD Process

Acquire device with recommended specifications



Read and discuss the Junior Campus BYOD iPad Program Charter with your child



Sign the Junior Campus iPad Program Agreement form



Create an iTunes account and consider setting up family sharing



Update to iOS16 and download required apps



Bring the iPad to school in its protective case

Device Specifications

Recommend: iPad 7th Generation or later iPad Air (3rd generation) or later (Device must support iOS 16)

Minimum storage space of 32GB

Minimum 10.2 inch retina display

Protective Case (This protective case should cover both the front screen and the back of the iPad)

Screen protector

Cary bag or protective screen (For additional protection when traveling to and from school)

Please note devices other than iPads will not be supported: i.e. Android or Windows Tablet Devices
