## Dress Code



# Rationale

In accordance with section 360 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (QLD), a principal may develop a student dress code that will apply when students are attending, or representing, the school. When developing a dress code, the Principal must ensure it is compliant with the guidelines, as described in this procedure.

Nambour State College dress standards reflect the community expectations and standards as determined by the Principal in consultation with school community representatives.

## Aims:

Nambour State College believes that a clearly stated and sensibly implemented Uniform Policy is important for the following reasons:

- To provide a safe, respectful learning environment
- To provide a sense of identity and belonging for students attending the school.
- To provide an opportunity for parents and staff to instil in students a sense of pride in their school.

It is our policy that the correct school uniform is worn each day, and we urge parents to support the accepted standard of dress as detailed.



# Dress Code 2026

## Formal Uniform for Years 7–12

Can be worn any day but must be worn on formal occasions.

- NSC blue stripe shirt – must be purchased from the college
- NSC black and gold or black striped tie (optional) – must be purchased from the college
- NSC black college skirt, worn below mid-thigh – must be purchased from the college
- NSC black college shorts, worn below mid-thigh – must be purchased from the college
- NSC black college jacket (zip-up) – must be purchased from the college
- Senior jersey for Year 12 students – must be purchased from the college
- Plain black pants
- Beige or black stockings, no patterns and not footless
- Plain white or black socks with no markings
- Other: When required, blazers and formal hats are loaned to students representing the school on formal occasions

## Non-Formal Uniform for Years 7–12

To be worn every day, except for formal occasions.

- NSC polo shirt:
  - Years 7–9: royal blue and black
  - Years 10–12: royal blue and white
  - (must be purchased from the college)
- NSC black college skirt, worn below mid-thigh – must be purchased from the college
- NSC black college shorts, worn below mid-thigh – must be purchased from the college
- NSC black college jumper (zip-up) – must be purchased from the college
- Senior jersey for Year 12 students – must be purchased from the college
- Plain black track pants
- Plain black pants
- Beige or black stockings, no patterns and not footless
- Plain white or black socks with no markings
- Black shoes or joggers made from leather, suede or vinyl – no shoes above ankle height and no boots

## Other Year 7–12 Uniform Items

- Thundershirt sport shirt – only to be worn when playing sport; must be purchased from the uniform shop
- Other NSC team shirts – only to be worn when engaging in team activities
- Rings: plain and flat, no sharp edges, one per hand
- Ear piercings: small studs or sleepers only
- Religious and medical pendants/bracelets to be worn under the shirt
- NSC black wide-brimmed hat (available from the uniform shop) or any other appropriate hat
- Religious headwear as determined by religious observance

## Not Permitted

- Jeans, tights or leggings
- Mini shorts or skirts
- Visible undershirts
- Other facial piercings
- Watches during exams
- Non-religious and non-medical bracelets and pendants
- Visible make-up
- Nail polish
- Bright or unnaturally coloured hair is not allowed
- Tattoos and body art must be covered at all times

## Note

- Exemptions from the dress code can be requested from the administration of the college.
- Alternative/custom sizing can be organised through the Uniform Shop (e.g. extra length, larger sizing).
